WYT DELEGATES Among Georgia's Best and Brightest



eorgia's 112 delegates representing 37 electric membership corporations (EMCs) were among nearly

1,800 high school students nationwide who visited Washington, D.C., in June for the Washington Youth Tour.

The event June 14-21, 2024, was the 59th year Georgia's EMCs sent students on the Youth Tour (10079112-001).

Once a year, high school students are selected by the state's EMCs to represent Georgia as delegates on the all-expenses-paid trip. This leadership experience includes meetings with state and national leaders, leadership training and visits to many major sites.

The Washington Youth Tour experience gives delegates an opportunity to visit as many as 25 of Washington, D.C.'s most historic sites, as well as participate in team-building activities and events during which they can learn more about one another and meet delegates from throughout the United States.

White House

One of the first stops on the weeklong Youth Tour was a photo opportunity at the White House. The location at 1600 Pennsylvania Ave. NW in Washington, D.C., was selected by former President George Washington in 1791 as the future home of our nation's president (10075300-001). There are 132 rooms, 35 bathrooms and six levels in the White House, and, on average, 6,000 people visit it daily.

Library of Congress

The Library of Congress was founded in 1800 and is the oldest federal cultural institution in the nation. It is the largest library in the world, with millions of items in a variety of formats. It includes international collections, a law library, rare books and manuscripts, and audiovisual collections.

Riverboat Cruise

The Washington Youth Tour Riverboat Cruise allowed delegates to get a picturesque view of the landscape along the Potomac River. During the nearly three-hour cruise, Georgia students were joined by WYT delegates from North Dakota and Montana.

George Washington's Mount Vernon Located about 13 miles outside Washington, D.C., George

Located about 13 miles outside Washington, D.C., George Washington's Mount Vernon is the former home of the United States' first president and his wife, Martha. The estate features

a mansion and dozens of historic outbuildings, a blacksmith shop, farm and wharf.

During their visit, WYT delegates toured the grounds, checked out the inside of Washington's mansion, visited the tombs of George and Martha Washington, listened to historic reenactors describe the former president's farming practices and enjoyed lunch at the famed Mount Vernon Inn Restaurant.

Presidential and War Memorials

There are seven presidential memorials and nearly 20 war memorials in Washington, D.C. These include the Jefferson Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial and the National World War II Memorial.

Georgia's delegation learned the history of many memorials from experienced tour guides, snapped photos along the Tidal Basin near the National Mall and at memorial parks, and read Father's Day messages left by family members at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Arlington National Cemetery Established in 1864, Arlington National Cemetery encom-

Established in 1864, Arlington National Cemetery encompasses 639 acres and contains the remains of service members from both world wars and the conflict in Korea.

Located within the cemetery is the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, where delegates attended a special wreath-laying ceremony honoring U.S. military and veterans (10031670-002).

The 2025 Washington Youth Tour is scheduled for June 13-20. This all-expenses-paid event will feature visits to and tours of some of the United States' most iconic and historic venues, such as George Washington's Mount Vernon, the Smithsonian Institution, Arlington National Cemetery and the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum.

Jefferson Energy Foundation Scholarship

e are now accepting applications for the JEC Foundation Scholarship. The last day to submit applications is March 28.

Applications will be accepted ONLINE ONLY.

Walter Harrison Scholarship: Apply by Jan. 31

he cost of attending a public college is continually increasing. Private colleges take an even more significant chunk out of a student's or family's budget. Keeping in mind those sobering statistics, and to



provide a measure of relief for those seeking a college education, Jefferson Energy encourages students to submit applications for the Walter Harrison Scholarship, a program sponsored by Georgia's 41 electric cooperatives.

The \$1,000 scholarship can be applied to academic expenses at any accredited two- or four-year university, college or vocational-technical institute in Georgia. Factors used for consideration include grade-point average, SAT scores, academic standing, scholastic honors and financial need.

A scholarship committee, composed of EMC directors and managers, selects students who excel in these areas and struggle with college expenses.

Students who apply for the scholarship must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited undergraduate degree program in Georgia. (10053698-001) They must also complete an application and write an autobiographical sketch with a preview of their future plans. (9995064-002)

The scholarship is partially funded through a silent auction held each year at Georgia EMC's Annual Meeting. The 41 electric co-ops throughout Georgia donate unique items representative of every region of the state.

Sixteen scholarships were awarded statewide in 2024. To apply for the Walter Harrison Scholarship during the 2024-25 school year, students should contact Jefferson Energy at (877) 533-3377, ext. 5055, email us at *ssaunders@jec.coop* or visit *www.jec.coop*. Completed applications are due by **Jan. 31**.

Created in 1985 by the Board of Directors of Georgia EMC, the scholarship pays tribute to the late Walter Harrison, a pioneer in the rural electric movement, and a leader at local, state and national levels in the electric cooperative program.
